
As a school we believe in the highest of standards, with our students inspired to excel in life. Hopefully you agree that the items captured in this newsletter are helping our pupils to do just that.

Women's Football World Cup Qualification

The game was extremely exciting with Wales dominating play and having plenty of shots on goal. So much so, that twenty minutes into the game several Year 7 pupils asked, "Can we come again?" Despite the Welsh dominance throughout the game,

the score at full time was 0-0 and the girls were treated to a further 30 minutes of exciting and skilful football. Wales eventually went on to win in extra time with a superbly taken goal by Jess Fishlock.

At the end of the game, Jess and the rest of the Wales team came over to thank the crowd and the girls were delighted to have the opportunity for autographs and selfies with the players.

A fantastic experience for all the girls - one that they will remember of a very long time!

STEM Competition

A group of Year 10 pupils recently visited Coleg Gwent as part of a STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering & Maths) Transition Event. Pupils competed against other local schools to write computer code to fly drones. During the session they learnt how to write algorithms for their drone to make it take-off, land, perform flips and somersaults. The Coleg Gwent staff were very impressed with the analytical and problemsolving skills shown by our pupils. Despite the other competitors all being in Year 11, our pupils were judged to have written the best code – their winning entry synchronised two drones to perform a dance with each other!

BBC100

As part of the BBC 100 celebrations, the BBC sent a team in to speak with pupils in years 8-10. The team spoke about their roles within the BBC and also shared stories of overcoming adversity. Pupils were also given the chance to ask questions about the stories and job roles.

The BBC team also introduced the BBC Young Reporter competition to pupils. This is a competition where young people are invited to submit their own ideas for news stories.



Krakow Visit

During October half term, the Religion, Values and Ethics department took 29 Religious Studies and History GCSE pupils to Krakow, Poland. This was the first foreign school trip since Covid-19 and for some pupils it was their first time flying. The aim of the visit was to learn more about the Holocaust and to gain a greater appreciation of the human experience of World War II. We stayed in a hotel a few minutes' walk from the centre of Krakow. This provided us with the opportunity to



explore the centre of Krakow by visiting the cloth tower and the famous St Mary's Church. During the trip, our pupils also met a Holocaust survivor who spoke about how she lost most of her family in the Holocaust. We also visited Schindler's Factory, the Jewish quarter, the Ghetto, Hero's Square and Auschwitz-Birkenau.

In Auschwitz-Birkenau we saw Jewish prayer shawls, glasses, shoes, hair and suitcases with names on. We also visited the gas chambers and the dungeons where the famous Catholic priest Father Maximilian Kolbe died. We also saw the wooden living barracks and walked along the train track that is often seen in documentaries about the Holocaust. At the end of the train track we reflected about those who suffered and how lucky we are



today. The visit to Auschwitz-Birkenau was a deeply moving experience for our pupils as they saw the impact of war on human life.




Book Club
